Chernenko Health Concern Eases

UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL. MOSCOW — A member of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, Gen. John Vessey, the highest ranking American military officer to visit the People's Republic of China, flew to the northeastern industrial city of Shenyang after three days of high-level military talks in Peking.

The announcement of Grishin's trip dampened speculation that Chernenko was gravely ill. The 11 voting and six "candidate" members of the Politburo, the executive committee of the Communist Party, would be unlikely to leave Moscow if Chernenko was critically ill.

U.S. General Sees Chinese Maneuvers

UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL. Peking — The chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, Gen. John Vessey, the highest ranking American military officer to visit the People's Republic of China, flew to the northeastern industrial city of Shenyang after three days of high-level military talks in Peking.

Scores Are Our Raquet

Vessey, 63, was to be given a glimpse of field exercises by the 4.2 million-member People's Liberation Army. Shenyang, a major industrial city 450 miles northwest of the Soviet Pacific port of Vladivostok, is headquarters for a strategic military region that is surrounded on three sides by the Soviet Union and was the scene of a series of bitter Sino-Soviet border clashes in 1969.
